

# The West Virginia State Shoot at Charleston

## Dr. Roscoe Stotts Wins 16-Yard Championship; J. E. Heileman the Doubles, and B. R. Walters, the Handicap.

THE West Virginia state shoot was held at Charleston on June 7, 8 and 9, with a good attendance from the state and several entries from Kentucky, Ohio, and Maryland. Sixty shooters took part on practice day and eighty-five on Wednesday and Thursday. 37,400 targets were thrown in the regular events.

The Charleston Gun Club, of which Geo. D. Cochrane is secretary, received a vote of thanks for its smooth handling of the shoot. Cochrane is also the state secretary and took the leading part in getting up the program and managing the shoot. The principal events were won in this order: State 16-yard championship, Dr. Roscoe Stotts, Kenova, W. Va., scored 193x200 on shoot-off with J. H. Friend, Charleston, who became runner-up; state doubles championship, J. E. Heilman, St. Marys, 81x100; state handicap, B. R. Walters, Mt. Hope, W. Va., 96x100, from 17 yards, after a tie and shoot-off with J. H. Friend; women's state championship, Mrs. Bunny A. Sanders, Keyser, after a tie on 172x200, and shoot-off with Mrs. L. E. Rogers, Parkersburg; all-round championship, J. H. Friend, 363x400; runner-up, J. B. Lallance, Huntington, 361; Junior state championship, Henry Kramer, Parkersburg, 182x200; state pro championship, singles, H. M. Shaull, Huntington, 187; runner-up, H. Whiting, Glenville. He also won the state doubles, handicap and all-around with 65x100, 96x100, and 346x400, respectively. W. H. Hall, Maysville, Ky., had high score on 400 targets, 299; John R. Taylor, Newark, O., pro, broke 37x400.

At the state meeting the 1928 tournament was awarded to the Logan club, and officers, all of that club, elected:

C. C. Chambers, president; Henry M. Moore, vice-president; W. H. Moss, secretary-treasurer; Geo. D. Cochrane was elected director in the A. T. A. from West Virginia. An executive committee, composed of Dr. J. O. Bailiff, Mullens; J. B. Lallance, Huntington; L. E. Dinsmore, St. Marys; Hubert Kelly, Charleston; J. Sloan Arnold, Keyser; E. F. Ball, Parkersburg, and L. G. Kincheloe, Clarksburg, was elected. Clubs represented at the meeting were: Charleston, Parkersburg, Wyoming, St. Marys, Huntington, Meadow Lark, Logan, and Clarksburg.
